Non Disclosure Agreement

1. Non-Disclosure of Case Information The individual named (hereinafter referred to as "the Recipient") is hereby prohibited from discussing, disclosing, or communicating any information related to the legal case identified to any third party, including but not limited to family members, friends, colleagues, the media, social media, or any public or private forums. This includes, without limitation, all case details, legal strategies, witness information, settlement discussions, or any other aspects of the Case.

2. Scope of Non-Disclosure

The Recipient shall not disclose, discuss, or share any information about the Case:

- Verbally or in writing.
- Through digital communications or social media platforms,
- In any public or private conversation, meeting, or gathering.
- In any form of media, including print, radio, television, or online channels.

3. Confidentiality Obligation

The Recipient agrees that the confidentiality obligation remains in effect indefinitely, even after the conclusion of the Case, unless otherwise authorized by the Disclosing Party, the court, or other relevant authorities.

4. Penalties for Breach

The Recipient is informed that any violation of this Non-Disclosure Order may result in legal consequences, including but not limited to contempt of court, sanctions, and claims for damages, which may be pursued by the Disclosing Party or other interested parties.

NOTICE:

By receiving and being made aware of this Non-Disclosure Order, the Recipient is bound by its terms. Non-compliance with this order may result in legal consequences as outlined above.

This Non-Disclosure Order serves to legally enforce confidentiality regarding a case and prevent any discussions about it, except with legal counsel or in accordance with legal procedures.



Make and Maintain Contact Order

In accordance with 17 U.S.C. § 2703(a)(1), the deputized Sheriffs of the civil division shall make positive contact with all individuals charged with felonies who are protected under the provisions of the first offender's Surety coalition

In accordance with 17 U.S.C. § 2703(a)(2), all defendants who have elected alleviation through the civil process through the first offender's Surety coalition shall consent to maintain positive contact with the supervising deputy for the duration of the civil process or until positive confirmation of detainment.

In accordance with 17 O.S.O.S 2793(9)(5), all defendants shall provide the last three digits of their vehicle's odometer reading and their estimated time of arrival upon request by the sheriff deputy before the defendant departs any location. The Sheriffs deputy supervising the defendant's maintain contact order shall intermittently check in with the defendant while they're traveling to ensure the defendant's compliance and well-being.

Compliance with this order is monitored and recorded autonomously through the Sheriff and his deputy's communications systems. Monitoring shall consist of, but is not limited to, all in-person conversations, mobile phone conversations, and third-party application use. Any perceived violations of this order shall result in an automated red flag placed upon the defendant's record.
